Dear Parents & Carers

I hope you are managing as best you can under the circumstances. The messages on the Dojo are showing some very creative approaches to having some fun enjoying the sunshine whilst maintaining the lockdown rules. I know this is not an easy time and it is challenging for many of you in different ways. We are here to support you and urge you to contact us whenever you need. We will do our best to support you as we work through this together.



The government guidelines are very clear and are absolutely necessary.

You should only leave the house for very limited purposes:

- shopping for basic necessities, for example food and medicine, which must be as infrequent as possible
- one form of exercise a day, for example a run, walk, or cycle alone or with members of your household
- any medical need, including to donate blood, avoid or escape risk of injury or harm, or to provide care or to help a vulnerable person
- travelling for work purposes, but only where you cannot work from home

Critical Workers' Children

We will be returning to work on Tuesday 14th April with the majority of staff working from home. A limited number of key staff members will be supervising children whose parents are defined as critical workers. We remain open only for those children who absolutely need to attend. If your employment circumstances have changed since we sent out the questionnaire then please do get in touch urgently. Once verified you will be able to book the sessions needed using the Schoolcomms

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system. It is critical that this is requested in good time so the correct supervision can be arranged depending on the numbers, the age and the needs of the pupils. Limiting the number of staff on the school site to essential numbers relies on the bookings being made as soon as you are aware of your work requirements. Please make direct contact using the Dojo or email admin@ntcps.co.uk. We will be observing the social distancing rules and ask that you remind your children about the 2 metre rule. This is for everyone's safety.

Will I be counted as a critical worker?

Critical workers include NHS staff, police, farmers and food retail workers, who need to be able to go out to work.

Children with a parent or carer who is listed on the government's <u>critical worker list</u> should be considered for a school place.

If children can stay safely at home, they should, to limit the chance of the virus spreading. That is why the government has asked parents to keep their children at home, wherever possible, and asked schools to remain open only for those children who absolutely need to attend.

Please do not enter the school The main gates will remain closed. A member of staff will collect the children at 9am. At the end of the session please wait at the gates for your children to be returned. Thank you
