Dear Parents & Carers

Coronavirus

At present, we have no known cases of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) among pupils or staff. We continue to monitor the health of all pupils carefully, and to remind pupils and staff frequently of the need for scrupulous

personal hygiene. The school continues to closely monitor and comply with the latest advice issued by Public Health England and the Government. We have heightened the school's own hygiene measures and we would appreciate your support in reinforcing these important messages at home.

May I request that, in line with the advice from the Government, you do not send your child to school if s/he, or any immediate family members, have visited the specified areas or countries listed in the following link since 9 March.

Additionally, your child should not come to school should s/he develop flu-like symptoms, specifically either:

- A high temperature (37.8 degrees and above)
- · A new, continuous cough

To support the delay of the spread of the virus, the Department for Health and Social Care has asked anyone who shows certain symptoms to stay at home for 7 days, regardless of whether they have travelled to affected areas. This means people should stay at home and avoid all but essential contact with others for 7 days from the point of displaying mild symptoms, to slow the spread of infection.

S/he should follow the advice given in the link below: to stay at home and self-isolate for seven days.

We are nonetheless making plans to support remote learning for pupils if the school should be required to close at any point.

If any of the current advice from Public Health England changes, please rest assured that we will respond accordingly.

I am confident that our pupils and staff will manage this challenging period in their characteristically positive way, so that academic progress is maintained as far as possible. I will, of course, keep you updated through the Dojo as the school receives further guidance.
