Science

Animals including humans

Pupils will learn the main body parts associated with the digestive system. They will learn about the different types of human teeth and their functions, thinking about how to look after them. They will construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey.

Sound

Pupils will learn how sounds are made and how they travel through the air to our ears. They will investigate how we can change the pitch and volume of sounds on a variety of instruments. They will also discover what happens to sounds across long distances. Working scientifically skills will be covered including making predictions, setting up a fair test and using different sorts of enquiry.

Autumn term

Geography

Volcanoes. Pupils will learn about the structure of the Earth, features of a volcano, famous volcanoes and earthquakes, preparing for an earthquake, what it's like living near a volcano.

History

The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. Pupils will learn about when and how the Romans invaded Britain, British resistance (Boudicca and her army), Hadrian's wall and why it was built and how the Romans changed the way of life in Britain.

Music

Taught by Mrs Mathews (music specialist). This term, children will be learning the song 'Mamma Mia' by Abba. They will appraise, play and develop rhythm patterns within the song on percussion instruments.

French

Developing reading, speaking, listening and writing skills through the topics of 'Portraits' and 'Clothes'. They will learn new vocabulary and how to describe appearance. There will be a grammar focus on adjectival agreement.

Art / Design & Technology

Art: Children will learn formal skills in art including charcoal mark making, printing and reflection and symmetry.

DT: Sculpture.

Personal Social Health Education

To include a focus on returning to school, mental health, emotions and 'living in the wider world' (including money, rights, responsibilities and laws).
