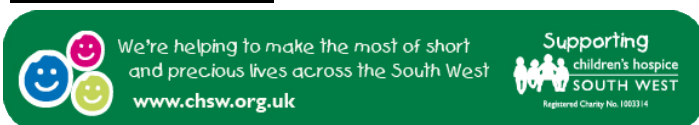

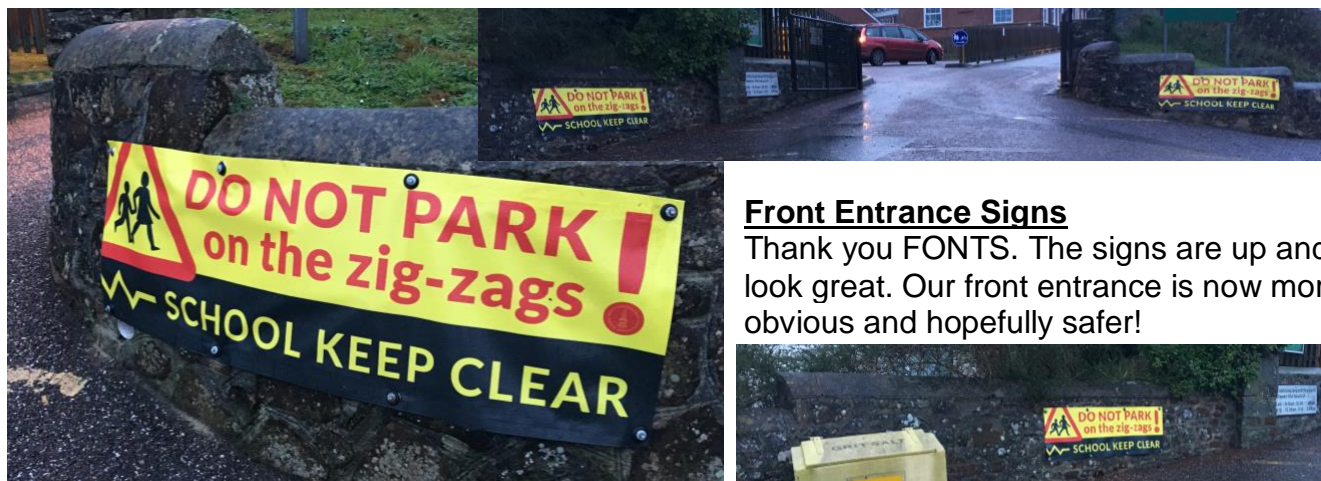
Date for the Diary from Reverend Nick Weldon

Kaleb's Thumbprint was established by a local family in the town of North Tawton. Luke's son Kaleb was diagnosed with a life limiting condition and unfortunately passed away when he was 18 months old.

After Kaleb passed away Luke and Kaleb's Mum were put into the safe hands of Children's Hospice South West who helped and supported them through after life care.

As a family we vowed to raise awareness for Children's Hospice South West as before Kaleb we had never heard or visited the charity.

Over the last 2 years we have done lots of local events to raise money, we've had a summer fete, coffee mornings, Christmas events, bingo and curry and quiz night.

We have done larger events under the Children's Hospice South West umbrella such as Marshalling Great West Run, Santa Run, radio interviews, stage interview at Women's Race Series and giving medals out on the finish line of Exeter Half Marathon. We also were lucky enough to attend Fly Day at Exeter airport where local pilots donate time and fuel to take children up in their planes as most children will never be able to fly to high altitude because they are oxygen tank supported.

Luke started running as a focus during Kaleb's short life. Luke has run over 20 half marathons and the London Marathon in April 2017 in 3 hours 48 minutes.

Kaleb's Thumbprint are looking forward to more local events and getting more involved with the local school.
