Dinner Money

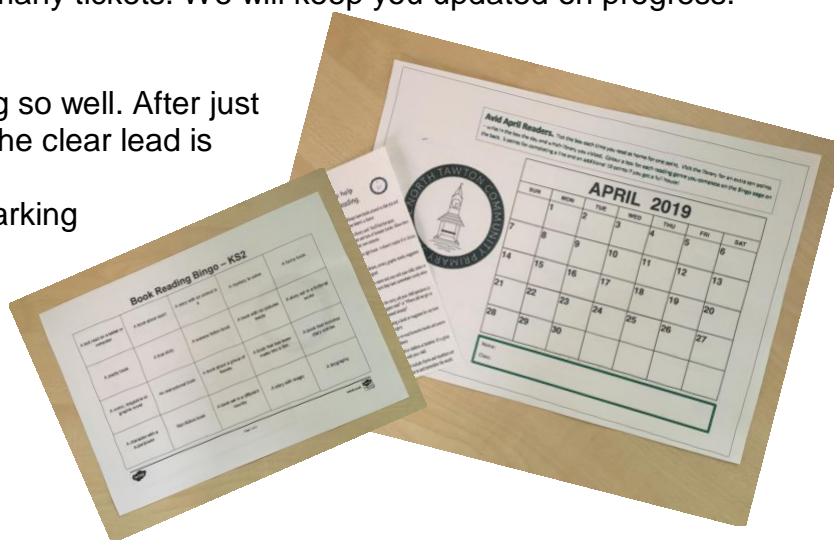
Please don't forget that we are in the process of moving to a different booking system, so do not buy too many tickets. We will keep you updated on progress.
